

Having worked all his life in a family business supplying and repairing welding equipment, Ken Metcalfe retired early and moved to Cornwall. Recalling the stories he used to make up for his children when they were little, with time on his hands he found himself inventing new tales.

"I had attempted to write books when I was much younger, but because I was so busy I found it impossible; all my energies went into helping raise four young children and running a business. But I have always had stories running around in my head and wished I had written down some of the plots. I thought the opportunity to write had passed me by, but occasionally when going to sleep at night I would nod off into one of my stories and then wake with it vividly and fully-formed in my head. 'Toad' was a story that continued to develop in my head as the day went on, so this time I decided to write it down. I didn't stop writing for three months!"
